**BINIARROCA**

*Some of our favorite natural spaces*



**Lithica**, a magical space carved into the rock, near Ciutadella.



**Cova de S'aigua**, a natural cave of great geological and archaeological importance, Cala Blanca.



**Cova des Coloms**, a huge cave inside the Binigaus ravine, known as "The Cathedral", Es Migjorn Gran.



**Menorca starlight**, since 2019 the sky of Menorca has been recognised as a Starlight Destination and Reserve.



**Quarries of Menorca**, natural spaces shaped by human intervention. Found in several places: Alaior, Ferreries, Ciutadella...



**Albufera d'es Grau**, the natural park with a great diversity of natural environments. Es Grau, Mahón.



**Lighthouses of Menorca**, 7 unique buildings to enjoy the island's landscapes.



**Marine reserves** of the island (Illa de l'Aire, Illes Bledes, Northern Reserve...).



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*Activities to enjoy outdoors*



**Camí de cavalls**, the GR-223 route that runs along the entire coastline of Menorca, divided into 20 stages.



**Kayaking or stand-up paddleboarding**, discover the island's coastline from the sea and reach inaccessible places.



**Boat excursion**, enjoy the sea with a sailing trip or a traditional llaüt boat ride. Ask us for more information.



**Diving**, 10 diving centres around the island to discover Menorca and its marine landscapes.



**Cycling**, 185 km to explore the coastline, not suitable for beginners.



**Horse riding excursion**, not only to explore the island but also to discover Menorca's equestrian tradition.

*Some of the best beaches*



**Cala Presili**, unspoilt beach on the north coast, accessible by bus to the parking area from June to September, then a 30–45 minute walk.



**Santo Tomás**, beach on the south coast accessible by car, ideal for sunset views.



**Cala Pregonda**, unspoilt northern beach, 30 minutes walking from the parking area.



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**Es Grau**, beach with services, shallow waters and very calm sea.



**Arenal d'en Castell**, semi-urban beach on the north coast, famous for its crescent-moon shape.



**Cala Trebalúger**, unspoilt cove without services, 40 minutes walking from Cala Mitjana.

*Art and culture: festivals, markets, local celebrations, museums*



**Hauser & Wirth**, an 18th-century hospital converted into an art gallery.



**LOAC**, Alaior Contemporary Art Museum with works by internationally renowned artists.



**Museu de Menorca**, museum of the island's history, archaeology and culture.



**Es Claustre**, cultural venue in Mahón with a varied programme of concerts and performing arts.



**Galerías de arte**, the island offers more and more artistic proposals for all tastes.



**Festivals**, jazz, classical music, for children and adults, or in unique locations.



**Artisan, evening and farmers' markets** for all tastes.



**Local festivities**, an island tradition where horses play the leading role.



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*Wine route and local production*



**Salinas de la Concepción**, the only active salt flats on the island, using traditional and sustainable methods.



**Bodegas Binifadet**, winery with more than 30 years of wine production and minimal intervention methods.



**Bodegas Binitord**, small family winery producing a variety of wines and vermouth.



**Bodega Torralbenc**, more than 10 years of a life project combining tradition, landscape and culture.



**Subaida**, a dairy farm producing cheese, offering different visiting and tasting options.



**Binigarba**, cheeses made with Menorcan cow's milk following ancestral methods.



**Xoriguer Distillery**, family project with more than 80 years of history, now known worldwide.



**Grahame Pearce**, craft beer brewed in Sant Climent.



**Bolets de Menorca**, local mushroom cultivation with visits and tastings.



**Abarca sandals**, the island's iconic product, handmade by many small producers across the island.



**Productos Ecológicos Santo Domingo**, family project focused on organic and regenerative farming.



**Aceite de Binissaida**, guided visits to discover olive oil production and tasting.



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**Morvedra**, small premium olive oil plantation producing Picual, Arbequina and Arróniz varieties.



**Hort de Sant Patrici**, guided tours and tastings of wines and cheeses with the DO Maó-Menorca label..

*Talayotic Menorca: prehistoric archaeological sites*



**Naveta des Tudons**, iconic Talayotic monument and the most visited on the island, dating from 1400 BC.



**Torre d'en Galmès**, the largest prehistoric settlement on the island and in the Balearics.



**Trepucó**, prehistoric settlement dating from 800 BC, free entrance.

*Gastronomy: where to eat and drink*



**Ses Forquilles**, together with its sister restaurants Ses Culleres and the newly opened Caladeru by the sea.



**Tamarindos**, the Es Grau restaurant specialising in rice dishes and fish. This year they opened Casa Tirant in a magical setting.



**Trébol**, more than 50 years cooking local fish. Book in advance! Located in the beautiful harbour of Calesfont.



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**S'amarador**, in the port of Ciutadella, specialised in fish and seafood.



**Es Molí des Racó**, traditional Menorcan cuisine in the centre of the island, in Mercadal.



**En Caragol**, gourmet restaurant on the coast of Sant Lluís, focused on local produce and rice dishes.



**Bandidu**, informal pizzeria with grilled meats, cocktails and music at the end of the evening, in the port of Mahón.



**La Rueda**, over 70 years of Menorcan cuisine in the centre of Sant Lluís, casual atmosphere.



**S'Aturadeta Jardins**, beautiful garden terrace serving casual Mediterranean cuisine.



**Es Cranc Pelut**, rice and seafood restaurant in Fornells, a classic.



**Sa Cova del Sol**, grill restaurant in a pine forest overlooking the sea, in Cala Torret.



**Sa Punta**, Mediterranean restaurant with spectacular views over Mahón harbour.
